



## Hexagon Apron

A free pattern download by **skacel collection, Inc.**



**SKILL LEVEL:** Easy

**YARN WEIGHT:** DK, Light Worsted

**SIZE AND MATERIALS:** Each Hexagon is approx 5" x 5" (tip to tip)

Yarn	Hex 1 (make 13)	Hex 2 (make 12)
A	#5026 (Orchid)	#5029 (Watermelon)
B	#5025 (Heliotrope)	#5028 (Strawberry)
C	#5027 (Violet)	#5030 (Cranberry)
D	#5016 (Indigo)	#5016 (Indigo)

**Featured Yarn:** *Patina* by **Zitron**, 55% Merino, 45% Rayon; 120 yds / 50g ball. Shown in and uses one (1) ball each of the above colors.

**Optional Yarn:** *Simplicity* by **HiKoo**, 55% Merino Superwash, 28% Acrylic, 17% Nylon; 117 yds / 50g hank.

**addi Needles:**

US F (4 mm) crochet hook, or size needed to obtain gauge

**Additional Notions:**

Two D-rings; 3 yards ribbon (cut in half); tapestry needle.

All yarn and needles distributed by **skacel collection, Inc.**

**GAUGE:** See schematic

To save time, check your gauge and read all instructions thoroughly before beginning.

**INSTRUCTIONS:**

**Notes:** 1) This apron is a bit of a retro throwback! It is intended for use as a hosting apron, the apron you don just before you greet your guests and after all the messy work is done. For a more functional apron, choose a machine washable yarn like **Simplicity** by **HiKoo**. 2) Size may be easily adjusted with a change in hook size, but please be aware that additional yarn may be required.

With A, ch 6, join with a slip stitch to form ring.

**Rnd 1:** With A, ch 3, dc2tog into ring (counts as dc3tog), [chain 3, dc3tog into ring] 5 times, ch 1, 1 hdc into top of first cluster.

**Rnd 2:** With B, ch 3, dc2tog into space just made by hdc (counts as dc3tog), \*ch 3, work [dc3tog, ch 3, dc3tog] into next space: repeat from \* 4 more times, ch 3, dc3tog into last space, ch 1, 1 hdc into top of first cluster.

**Rnd 3:** With A, ch 3, dc2tog into arch formed by hdc (counts as dc3tog), \*ch 3, work [dc3tog, ch 3, dc3tog] into next space \*\*, ch 3, dc3tog into next sp; repeat from \* 4 more times and from \* to \*\* once, ch 1, 1 hdc into top of first cluster.

**Rnd 4:** With C, ch 3 (counts as 1 dc), dc into space just made by hdc, 3 dc into next space, \*[dc3tog, ch 3, dc3tog] into next space, 3dc in next 2 spaces\*; repeat from \* to \* 5 more times, [dc3tog, ch3, dc3tog] into next space, 1 dc in next space and join with slip stitch to ch 3.

**Rnd 5:** With D, ch 1, sc into same space, \*sc in top of each dc and dc3tog to ch 3 space, 3 sc into ch 3 space\*; repeat from \* to \* around, ending with a slip stitch to first sc. (66 sc sts)

Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Work a total of 25 hexagons (13 of Hex 1 & 12 of Hex 2).

Using the chart and photo for placement, arrange hexagons and join them together with D using a whipstitch.

**FINISHING:**

Sew D-rings to top two hexagons. Thread one half of ribbon through D-rings and tie behind neck. Use remaining ribbon as a waist tie.

**ABBREVIATIONS:**

**approx** approximately

**ch** chain

**dc** double crochet

**dc2tog** double crochet 2 together: \*yo, pull up a loop in indicated stitch, 3 loops on hook, yo, pull through 2 loops\*; repeat from \* to\* once more, yo, pull through all 3 loops on hook.

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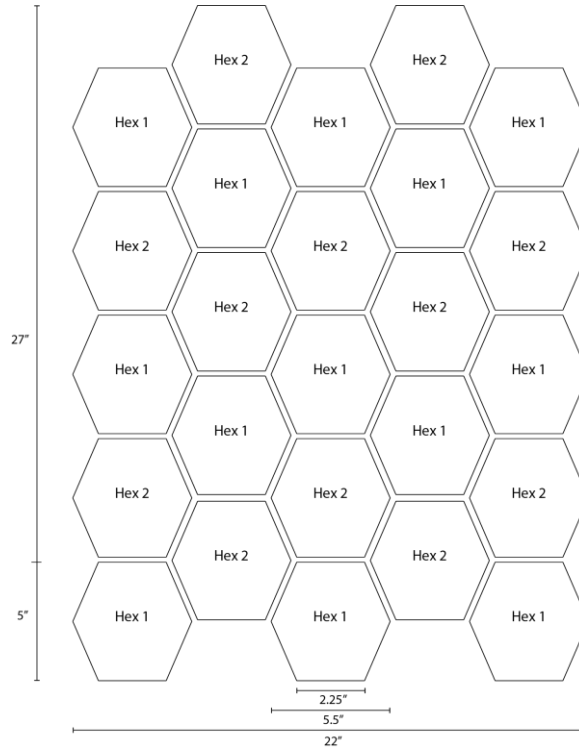
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**dc3tog** double crochet 3 together: \*yo, pull up a loop in indicated stitch, 3 loops on hook, yo, pull through 2 loops\*; repeat from \* to \* two times, yo, pull through all 4 loops on hook.

**hdc** half double crochet: yo, pull up a loop in next stitch, yo, draw through all three loops on hook.
